Fun Packs filled with games, activity ideas and craft resources

were delivered to many of the families we have worked with over recent years along with other families known to us on the Troydale Estate. We received £850 from We Love Manchester charity and £200 from TLG to enable us to do this, plus individual donations via our give.net page. Around 16 families - over 30 children - received packs. We were able to deliver two set of packs, one in April and one in June. Families sent lots of photos of what the children got up to.

are now working on plans to record stories to share with school virtually, school is eager for us provide the Bible stories in whatever way we can.

Rooted Youth Group

The 11-16s of Heathfield Church continue to meet weekly via Zoom, with a quiz, a short video reflection and group discussion. Some of the young people are being encouraged to take a more active role in the leadership of the group.




As a Local Mission Partner with Scripture Union we have received invaluable support

Catch Up plans and funding application

We have offered a number of activities to a local school including a Board Games Club and reading support, in response to the anticipated need of children as they return to school in September. Again, restriction guidelines will dictate when and how these new initiatives will begin.

We are pursuing funding to pay a manager and sessional senior worker to deliver these activities.
